The First Lesson, taken out of the Old Testament

Isaiah 1:10-18

Hear the word of the Lord, you rulers of Sodom!
Listen to the teaching of our God, you people of Gomorrah!
What to me is the multitude of your sacrifices? says the Lord;
I have had enough of burnt-offerings of rams and the fat of fed beasts;
I do not delight in the blood of bulls, or of lambs, or of goats.
When you come to appear before me, who asked this from your hand?
Trample my courts no more; bringing offerings is futile; incense is an
abomination to me.
New moon and sabbath and calling of convocation —
I cannot endure solemn assemblies with iniquity.
Your new moons and your appointed festivals my soul hates;
they have become a burden to me, I am weary of bearing them.
When you stretch out your hands, I will hide my eyes from you;
even though you make many prayers, I will not listen; your hands are full of
blood.
Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your doings
from before my eyes; cease to do evil, learn to do good;
seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow.
Come now, let us argue it out, says the Lord:
though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be like snow;
though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool.

The Second Lesson, taken out of the New Testament

2 Thessalonians 1:1-4, 11-12

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy,
To the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:
Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
We must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right,
because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for
one another is increasing. Therefore we ourselves boast of you among the
churches of God for your steadfastness and faith during all your persecutions
and the afflictions that you are enduring.
To this end we always pray for you, asking that our God will make you worthy
of his call and will fulfil by his power every good resolve and work of faith, so
that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him,
according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Gospel Reading

Luke 9:18-27


Once when Jesus was praying alone, with only the disciples near him, he asked
them, 'Who do the crowds say that I am?' They answered, 'John the Baptist;
but others, Elijah; and still others, that one of the ancient prophets has arisen.'
He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter answered, 'The Messiah
of God.'

He sternly ordered and commanded them not to tell anyone, saying, 'The Son
of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, chief
priests, and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised.'

Then he said to them all, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny
themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to
save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it.

What does it profit them if they gain the whole world, but lose or forfeit
themselves? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words, of them the Son
of Man will be ashamed when he comes in his glory and the glory of the Father
and of the holy angels.

But truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death
before they see the kingdom of God.'
